Spring curriculum: In addition to English and Maths, your child will be studying a particular topic into which many of their lesson will feed. Below is a synopsis of how the topic will be studied and some opportunities to extend learning at home.

Topic: Settlements
Pupils will understand what a settlement is and describe the differences between villages, towns and cities. They will learn key geographical vocabulary such as settlement and land use, and identify different types of land use including residential, commercial and agricultural. Pupils will locate cities and regions within the United Kingdom and describe the location of New Delhi in India. They will use maps, including OS maps, to identify features and follow routes, carry out fieldwork in the local area, and explain why human and physical features are located where they are. Pupils will compare land use in their local area with New Delhi, identifying similarities and differences, and begin to explain how and why settlements change over time.
